
Role of Youth Against Drug Abuse

Along with the regular forums and guest speaker sessions that are conducted frequently at Biztek, last semester we had a seminar with its own distinguished panel of speakers. Biztek and Anti narcotic force (ANF) Sind, Jointly organized a seminar on "Youth Awareness on Drug Abuse and Youth Affairs" On International Youth Day on August 12, 2008 at the Biztek Auditorium. Deputy speaker Sind Assembly Ms Shehla Raza was the Chief Guest. Speakers included Col Sherazi, Anti Narcotic Force; Dr. Zaman Sheikh, Director Dow Medical College, and Dr. Fouzia Khan, Deputy Director, Biztek Clifton campus.



In the lectures the Chief guest expressed her feeling and thoughts like: Since independence, several intoxicating items have been introduced in the country, however, besides heroin, opium and chars, the injections are the newest and easily product at medical stores.

The narcotics issue had become a big challenge for Pakistan, and we must keep our level best to tackle it despite limited resources. "Besides having low man-power and resources we are hopeful, and the rectification of narcotics problem is necessary not only for the country but the people of every part of life as well. The local body representatives along with the masses could make our cause efficient to eradicate narcotics problem,"



The statistics about drug problems in Pakistan are outdated and do not provide the whole view, as experts believe the affectees are increasing rapidly.

While Col Sherazi, Anti Narcotic Force intimated about some facts and figures on this critical issue, he quoted the survey report of the United Nation Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) conducted last year, in which it was revealed that Afghanistan is the largest producer of narcotics worldwide with an estimation of 93 percent of global opiates market. The survey also revealed that 193,000 hectares of opium poppies were cultivated with an increase of 17 percent over 2006. Though counter-narcotic and related counter-insurgency measures have been the national priorities for several years, little was known about the threat of drug use.









He said that more than 2,500 reported cases of HIV positive had been reported in various parts of Pakistan since the disease was officially acknowledged in late 80's. However, many believe the actual figures were much higher around

He told that the social factors such as unemployment leading to pure boredom were the main reasons for the abuse. Dr. Zaman Sheikh, Director Dow Medical College said that the drugs particularly heroin was introduced in Pakistan in 1979 after Afghan War, and Iranian Revolution. Before that Europe was the biggest international drug market, where the drugs had been smuggled there from Afghanistan via Iran and Turkey and this route was called golden crescent because of its shape.





It was held at university of London's Birkbeck Institute for

Social Research, London. The topic of Dr. Riaz's paper was "1968- Was it really year of Social Change

in Pakistan?" Paper discussed the Pakistani nation's struggle against General Ayub Khan for the restoration of democracy in the country. This struggle ultimately resulted in the holding of first general elections in the country. This paper would be published in April, 09 in the research paper published by University of Calcutta.


AS REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVE OF AAGS


BIZTEK DEAN PRESIDED ANNUAL LITERARY AWARDS CEREMONY 2008 DOHA (QATAR)


ztekians meet Prof. S. Ho

A group of biztek student visited Dr. Haroon Ahmed, President PAMH. The group was comprised of the following six students namely M. Sadique Rauf, Fahad Anwar, Shahid Masood, Asim Razzaq, Furgan Shahid and Rabistan Khan. It was conducted with the help & guidance of Dr. Riaz Ahmed Sheikh.

During the interview, we discussed with Dr. Haroon Ahmed about his personal and educational life, his services in different institutions, and his services for the well being and welfare of common and deprived people. Few of the most important things I want to share about such a prominent personality of Pakistan.

Dr. Haroon Ahmed belongs to a lower middle class family. He was born in 1931. His father was a railway servant. They used to live in a small quarter provided by the railway department.



He got admission in DOW MEDICAL COLLEGE Karachi for M.B.B.S in 1955.At that time, a lot of refugees came to Pakistan. He said that it was a fantastic tolerance age. People joined hands to support migrants and refugees. He actively participated in sports too. He was a good player of hockey and also participated in 800 meter race during his stay at medical college.

Due to his failure in getting admission for post graduation because of financial problems, he started house job as House Physician Medical Unit Civil Hospital & Dow Medical College, Karachi. At the time of his house job, he chose his field of specialization that was psychiatry.

He went to England on fellowship for his post graduation (D.P.M) in 1963; he also did his (M.R.C.Psych) in 1971 from London. He completed his education there six months earlier. Then he visited many areas, cities, institutes, universities and read many books there. After his arrival in Pakistan, he started his professional career from Jinnah Post Graduate Medical Centre in 1961-1974.

He married in 1972 with Dr. Anis Haroon, who is the Chairperson of Women Rights Organization, W.A.F (Women Action Forum) and remained a journalist and political worker. They have three children, and his daughter is also president of Women Rights Commission.

Dr. Haroon Ahmed acquired a number of prominent positions during his career. He not only served as a psychiatric but also as a well known professor. He is director of psychosocial centre and Hon. Executive director of free mental health clinic (PAMH) Karachi.


Dr. Haroon has also worked as a fellow and attended conferences as a country representative of World Health Organization (WHO). His further contributions to health and social sector are as follows:

- Member, Governing Body, Arts Council of Pakistan. 1981 1988.
- Vice President, South Asia Region of International Physicians for Prevention of Nuclear War (IPPNW) 1991 1993.
- Founder member "Pakistan India Peoples Forum for Peace and Democracy". Founder Conveners to Forum for Peace and Development 1995.
- Chairman, Action Committee Against Arms Race (ACAAR) 1998.
- Dr. S. Haroon Ahmed and his team are actively participating in a movement to save Karachi beach from being sold to the multinational companies and investors.

He has also written number of research based articles, which have been published in national and international journals and books. He is fond of reading poetry. He also has very appreciative approach towards paintings.

Overall it was an informative and motivational visit which motivated us to follow the path of such people who are really committed for the well being of human beings. We also invited him to visit BIZTEK, which he accepted and showed great concern to visit such a university.

There is a skill set gap, between the business world's needs and the university education.

But now, the S2B program helps university students improve their practical skills with Microsoft partners.

Computer Education in Pakistan

Pakistan is one of the few, fortunate countries in the world, rich in natural resources, with plenty of human talent and creativity complementing this wealth, waiting to be discovered. Once the available human potential is put into practice, the country will be well on its way to success and prosperity. Computer is the advanced and fast-growing technology of the world. Process of computerization started in 1960 with the installation of IBM-370 computer is now proceeding with a reasonable speed.

Basically the Computerized institutions in Pakistan can be divided into three basic classes - the government institutions, private institutions with foreign affiliations, and the totally locally-owned and operated institutions. Apart from all the above advocacies of IT culture in Pakistan, it would not be incorrect to say that the IT institutions of Pakistan have also created some misunderstanding in the market. What is IT? Is it computers and computers only? No, certainly not. Rather it would be more correct to say that the word IT - Information Technology, has actually been changed into IM - Information Management with the passage of time. The market as well as the IT institutions of Pakistan need to understand that, either they are producing business managers or they are producing computer people.

In Today's high-speed changing and hesitant business atmosphere, information has become a considered resource, significant to join together and optimize all other resources. It is a source / enabler for strategic advantage in some industries while it is a strategic business necessity in others. Progressively more, organizations, which lack potential to strategically utilize information, are risking their prosperity, growth and survival.

Savings in information management are twofold edged. There are several crash stories resulting in disasters, while quite a few organizations have reaped vast benefits and value creation from the same.

The Computer sector of Pakistan, given the work done to achieve the expected results, is the victim of over expectations. Initially, computer industry went unnoticed for years. In seventies, we had only handful of companies in Lahore and Karachi catering to public and private needs within Pakistan.

Eighties saw more hectic activity in the IT mainly because of accessibility of personal computers to small businesses and home users. This shows how young our industry is. I would not put the age of the industry more than about ten meager years. If we compare this to India, their first computer institute was established way back in the fifties. By 1980, their computer industry was already mature and well established; and no wonder they got the maximum benefit from the boom of nineties.

Every industry goes through good and then not so good phase.


Computer is different than our mainstream industry.

There are times when organizations invest aggressively to enhance their efficiency and productivity by going for the latest hardware and software and that marks the good phase for the Computer industry and in between until new technology arrives, there is a not so good phase with organizations curtailing their spending on software and hardware.

Fortunately for Pakistan there was a reasonable computerized structure in Pakistan at the time of the record boom in technology sector worldwide. Any industry that goes through such a rollercoaster ride and survives comes out as a mature industry. Similarly according to government sources only 200 odd software companies have survived these difficult times. The companies that were found in early or mid nineties were lucky to have seen all of this happening around them and now will benefit from the experience of surviving extreme times.

In five years that is around 2013 IT will be a very important export earner for Pakistan, however, any expectations from the Industry to bring in large sums of dollars to Pakistan in near future will again be an over expectation.





- 1) Graduates of highly ranked universities prefer to work in private sector instead of public institutions due to rapid growth opportunities in technical and financial aspects thus allowing the private sector to lead in the technological use and adaptation.
- 2) Government institutions do not always hire professionals on just merit bases thus lacking the high end resources that inadvertently would deploy high end systems. A side effect of this disparity between public and private sector is resulting in increased inefficiencies and failure of public institutions and organizations and ultimately gearing these organizations to be privatized to save them from ultimate demise. The private organizations on the other hand are changing the general culture of organizational behaviors and motivating more and more high-skilled professionals towards these private firms thus enabling a change of work style across board and improved work ethics and quality of out put.


